
Guidelines for Use of the Display Area at the Consulate-General of Japan in Melbourne

The Information and Culture Section of the Consulate-General of Japan maintains the exhibition display area as a space for artists or organisations to display artistic works related to Japanese culture. The presence of exhibit pieces does not constitute sponsorship or endorsement by the Consulate-General of Japan.

Placement of artwork is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The works of art offered for display must take into consideration general standards of decency and respect for the diverse beliefs and values of the local community. The Consulate-General of Japan does not permit the display of works which are offensive to decency, or which are of an obscene or immoral nature.
- 2. Each exhibitor is responsible for the installation and removal of the artwork. There are no storage spaces available.
- 3. Exhibitors are not permitted to sell or try to sell their works by any means, including but not limited to, placing prices on their works or embedding an advertisement for sale in their work descriptions. Exceptions may be made for special events and fundraising campaigns approved by the Consulate-General of Japan.
- 4. The Consulate-General of Japan will publicize scheduled displays via an e-newsletter, the Consulate-General of Japan in Melbourne website and social media pages (Facebook and Twitter). Exhibitors should notify the Consulate-General of Japan if they intend to conduct their own publicity.
- 5. The display cases should be left in the condition they were found.



Dimensions of the Display Cabinet

Cabinet ① 160 cm (L) x 80 cm (W) x 45 cm (D)

Horizontal width of each section within the cabinet : 80cm

Depth:

(a) of the glass sliding door at front to the back of cabinet: 60cm(b) of the glass shelves: 45cm

- The glass shelves are adjustable
- The front of the cabinet has lockable glass sliding doors
- The shelves are lit by small, interior lights
